This year the Annual Winter State titles will be held on the weekend of the 16<sup>th</sup> of May and the 17<sup>th</sup> of May 2009.

There has been extra division added to the State titles it is an All Tackle Division for a two year trial. Also attached to this letter is an extra score sheet Form Nine to score this division. The rules for this division appear in the new Queensland Handbook under the State titles rules. I have also pasted the rules into this letter below

### **All Tackle Division**

No line class required for this division i.e. Braid, Gel spun or heavy line classes.

Equipment must conform to ANSA Requirements.

For Qualification

Fish must be at least 1.5 times larger than the ANSA Q species list legal lengths  
 Any fish captured that qualifies as above will score 150 points  
 An angler may submit any number of species but no more than 1 of any species  
 Angler must record the overall length of each species on the form provided to be used to determine a winner in the case of a tied result. A formulary held by the State Convenor will be used to determine the winner.

An example could be a Spotted Mackerel it has a legal length of 60cm. (60cm x 1.5 = a score of 150 points). The angler who amasses the greatest score is the winner.

**NB. The fish may be kept or released**

The weigh-in for the State Titles must commence by 2pm on the 17<sup>th</sup> May 2009 and be completed by 4pm the same day. Each club or zone must notify the Events Co-ordinator on the above number or e-mail address no later than 6pm on 17<sup>th</sup> May 2009.

**Results sheets are to be sent by post to the above address within fourteen days ie form three, four, five, eight and nine.**

If your club does not have a copy of the rules of the State Titles please contact me and I will get a copy to you.

Please encourage your members to participate. Please note that there is a Family Division in the State titles: - refer to the rules on this division. The State Executive would like to encourage clubs to get their entire families involved.

Please read each page of this letter and attachments as there is information required to deal with the process of competing in the Winter State Titles.

## HOW TO COMPETE IN THE 2008-2009 ANSA QLD INC

### STATE TITLES

#### For Clubs

1. Read the Rule Book carefully.
2. Check your "Titles pack" and get to know it.
3. Copy sufficient of the forms for your use (including the rule book).
4. Teams must be nominated prior to the commencement of the competition.
5. Go fishing and have a great time.
6. Conduct the weigh-in in accordance with the rules.
7. e-mail or phone your **club summary** form to the Events Co-ordinator.

If you are taking part in a Zone Competition being run in conjunction with the Titles, then you may submit your results through the person nominated by the Zone Committee. Please ensure that they will be passing the results along to the Events Co-ordinator.

**STATE TITLES  
QUESTION AND ANSWER SHEET.**

1. I have just joined the Club. Am I eligible to fish the Titles?  
A. All financial members of ANSA Qld Inc. are eligible to compete in the Titles. Competitor names are checked against the list of financial members supplied by the State Membership Officer.
2. What do I do if I want to compete but my club doesn't want to get involved?  
A. Find a club that is competing and ask if they will process your details for you. Please note that they are not obliged to do this. Be aware that a host club may impose additional requirements on competitors.
3. Can we nominate our own team or does the club have the right to nominate which team I am in?  
A. This is entirely the decision of the Club. As the concept of the competition is to have fun, self-nominating teams are encouraged.
4. Can I fish in both light and standard tackle divisions?  
A. Yes, but you can only weigh a total of five fish. You may enter all in one category or the other, or split the catch between them. You may also fish the tagging competition at the same time.
5. Must our team all fish in the same boat?  
A. No! Your team members do not even have to fish in the same town. Your team must however report their results through the club that holds their nomination. (Note: a club may have more than one weigh-in point as long as the club ensures propriety in recording the results.)
6. We didn't win anything; do our results sheets have to be posted in?  
A. Yes. They are still needed and even a sheet that says nobody fished is useful.
7. Can my two children and I fish together as a team?  
A. Yes, but because the team contains a senior, the team will be recorded as a senior team. The juniors however will still be eligible for the individual junior awards.
8. If I catch three fish on standard tackle and two fish on 3kg, can I enter all the fish in the standard tackle section?  
A. Yes. However the results form must record the 3kg captures as being taken on 4kg and the points calculated appropriately. If a capture is recorded as being made on light tackle (1,2, or 3kg) then it is only eligible for the light tackle competition.
9. If I capture a fish that is already tagged, do I have to tag it again to score tagging points?  
A. No. Record the necessary details and release the fish. Points will be allocated as if you were the original tagger.
10. Which fish are eligible to be tagged for the State Titles?  
A. Those fish that are nominated by the State Tagging Co-ordinator prior to the State Championships as eligible species and points scored will be those allocated by the Tagging Co-ordinator for each species.  
Note: ANSA Qld is moving to a "project" basis for tagging and therefore some species and locations are unlikely to be available to all competitors.
11. When do I have to stop fishing?  
A. Cease fishing time is noon on the Sunday of competition. If you are playing a fish hooked prior to noon, then you may continue to fight the fish until it is captured or lost. Notwithstanding this allowance of extra time to complete a capture, your fish must be in the weigh-in area by 2.00 p.m. on Sunday afternoon. Failure to meet this requirement will result in disqualification.
